GREAT TEY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The Parish Council have received details of a Draft Scheme for 10 proposed dwellings on the Preferred Site at Brook Road. A copy of the layout is enclosed. The scheme is proposed by Granville Developments, and includes 6 single storey dwellings and 4 two storey semi-detached dwellings. The Parish Council has responded stating that they are not happy with the high proportion of bungalows included in the scheme, as this does not reflect the needs of our community, since we would like to encourage younger families into the village.


A week later we completed a short Sunday morning local walk around Great Tey, followed by a very welcome roast lunch in The Chequers to toast & celebrate Christmas.

BURNS & SCOLDS

Most of us at some time have had a burn or a scald so let's break them down and look at the treatment.

ESTIMATING THE SEVERITY OF A BURN

Size: anything larger than 1% of the body requires a medical assessment

(1% is the size of the hand of the casualty)

Cause: dry heat, wet heat, chemical, sunburn, electricity

Age: children and elderly should seek medical advice for any burn

Location: face, hands, feet, genitals or burns that go all the way down to the bone need medical treatment

Depth: all full thickness burns require hospital treatment.

Depth of burn

Superficial: burn or scald to outer layer, looks red sore and swollen

Partial thickness: burns both dermis and epidermis layers, looks raw and blisters

Full thickness: layers of skin burned away to the

subcutaneous fat layer, may look pale, charred or waxy normally no pain

TREATMENT

Do's

Cool the burn using cold water (if a mixer tap just a little

hot mixed in) ideally running

Place the water above the burn and allow to run down not directly on burn

Remove any jewellery and clothing before swelling starts unless stuck to flesh

Dress the burn with a sterile dressing that won't stick (cling film is excellent)

If burn is severe or the casualty has breathed in smoke or fumes call 999 for emergency help

Don'ts

- Burst blisters
- Apply creams or fats
- Apply adhesive dressings
- Cool the burn using ice


ACID BURNS TREATMENT

Avoid getting acid on yourself

- Remove contaminated clothing
- Rinse burns with lots of water
- Lean casualty forward pour water over back of head
- Wash out eyes directly
- Call 999 quickly.

The Parish Council have arranged this year's annual litter pick to be on Saturday 9th March. We are meeting at the Village Hall at 9.30am and equipment will be provided. Please bring gloves. We will have refreshments afterwards.

WEST TEY UPDATE

The Authorities have now written to the Inspector setting out what they wish to do next about the Section 1 Plan (Garden Communities), and their timetable. Essentially, they have chosen 'Option 2 with caveats'. This means continuing work on Section 1, with some caveats such as the need for guaranteed infrastructure, built in. Importantly, this means that the District Local Plans (Section 2) are now blocked, leaving the door

open to speculative development in Braintree, where there is no five year supply. West Tey and the two other previously selected garden communities will be assessed, along with a large number of additional sites. In response, CAUSE has written to the authorities, copying in the Inspector, setting out our concerns which include:

- Unrealistic timetable the intention is to submit a Plan to the Inspector by March 2019.
- Lack of objective thinking the public is being told that the new Plan simply requires more work on the same three garden communities. This is not the case. All options must be examined.
- Sites are being assessed in a vacuum. How can any of the proposals be shown to be viable in the absence of a strategic plan for infrastructure?
- The A120 dualling has not yet been guaranteed. The A12 consultation has been delayed again to early 2019 and there is huge uncertainty about route & timing, given the authorities' bid for £100m from government to re-route the A12 through Copford to encircle 8,000 West Tey homes.
- Mass Rapid Transit plans must be shown to feasible and costed and funding sources identified. Unlikely by end of this year.
- West Tey station.... Must be shown to be feasible and viable.
- The sustainability appraisal methodology must be consulted on.
- The Plan must be consulted on.

We await the Inspector's response to the Authorities letter with baited breath.
