GREAT TEY FIRST AID


Asthma

An asthma attack is a reaction in the lungs, triggered by such things as dust, pollen, smoking, exercise, stress or infection etc.

Muscles around the tiny windpipes in the lungs go into spasm and constrict. This makes it very difficult for the casualty to breathe.

Most asthma sufferers carry medication to help them when having an attack.

This is normally in the form of an inhaler. These help open the wind pipes to relieve the condition.



Recognition

- 1. Difficulty breathing
- 2. Wheezy noise originating from the lungs
- 3. Difficulty speaking
- 4. Pale & clammy skin
- 5. Use of muscles in neck and upper chest when breathing
- 6. May cause exhaustion in severe cases
- Prolonged attack may cause unconsciousness or stop breathing

Treatment

Help the casualty sit upright

Assist them with their reliever inhaler (this can be repeated if attack doesn't ease).

Use a spacer device if available


Try to take casualties mind off attack, reassure, calm and make light conversation

Call 999/112 for emergency help if no inhaler of condition worsens.

Cold air can make attack worse

GREAT TEY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to our consultation process to date, regarding the Neighbourhood Plan. The Neighbourhood Plan Group has now compiled a report based on the comments received. The main issues raised are recorded below under the relevant headings:

ENVIRONMENT

- More trees and hedgerows needed
- Create pond and wildlife habitats
- Better recycling arrangements
- Increased population will lead to increased traffic/pollution

HOUSING

- More dwellings would benefit the school, pubs, church and transport infrastructure
- There is a preference for smaller scale developments
- More social/affordable dwellings to encourage young families
- Design of new dwellings to be in keeping with existing properties
- No need for more executive type dwellings Employment
- Can a local directory of businesses be produced?
- We need opportunities in agriculture and small businesses. Maybe expand existing commercial sites, e.g. Teybrook Centre
- No increase in transport related businesses
- New retail or leisure facilities would create employment opportunities

LEISURE

- We need to support the local pubs
- Parishioners would like a community hub, with shop and leisure facilities
- The village hall offers a range of activities, but needs to be better supported. There is some support for a new village hall on the recreation ground
- We need more facilities for teens and young adults
- The playing fields are under used and poorly maintained
- There is a lot of support for the school swimming pool project Infrastructure
- The quality of local roads and their maintenance is poor

- There is a lack of pavements
- A better bus service is needed
- Broadband speed is inconsistent
- Can we have mains gas in the village?
- The existing drainage and sewage facilities would not be able to cope with any major development
- There is a lot of support for a village shop

OTHER COMMENTS

Whilst not relevant to any specific heading, there was the strong opinion expressed throughout that Great Tey should retain its village status and not be subsumed within any proposed 'garden community' or other major development.

NEXT STEPS

We hope this report will encourage people to comment and respond so that we can formulate our visions and objectives for the future of the Parish. These, along with an evidence base which is being compiled, will be used to produce the first draft of the Great Tey Neighbourhood Plan.

NORTH ESSEX GARDEN COMMUNITIES - WHAT'S THE LATEST?

Last year, after the garden community proposals were found unsound, the authorities selected Inspector's 'Option 2' – to continue to onwards with their garden community plans.

They are now looking at around 24 different large sites across north Essex, including their favoured three (West Tey, East Colchester and West of Braintree). North Essex Garden Communities Limited is beavering away on its own 'master-developer' plans for these three.

No legal opinion on State Aid rules has been obtained by the authorities but it seems highly questionable to fund a state master-developer and expect private developers to compete on a level playing field. The authorities have not provided evidence of viability or a legal opinion on the 'sustainability appraisal as a whole', both things the Inspector requested before further work. Meanwhile, the developers continue to promote their own sites to councillors.

You may remember that CAUSE lobbied for Inspector's 'Option 1', which would have allowed

each district's Local Plan to proceed, giving protection against speculative developer applications. We warned that Option 2 would open the doors to speculative applications and, sadly, that is just what is happening, with developers (particularly in Braintree) citing the lack of Local Plan as justification for their proposals.

The next stage will be a public consultation, probably this summer, on the latest proposals and evidence put forward by the authorities and we will need public support. We will arrange a house-to-house leaflet drop to inform you when the consultation is live. We would greatly appreciate assistance with this – we have an enormous area to cover.
