## Choking for Adults and Children

This often happens whilst eating or drinking. This can easily be done by small objects becoming lodged in the airway accidently rather than being swallowed.

Two main types of choking either a mild choke or a severe choke.

## Mild Choking

The person may be able to cough or talk Reassure and offer help to assist.

## Severe Choking


- Weakening cough
- Unable to speak
- Distressed look on face
- Struggling to breathe
- Can be come unconscious if not treated

## Treatment

- Tell person to cough
- Shout for help
- If ineffective then
- Stand by side of person
- Bend them over so mouth points at floor
- Give up to 5 back blows between shoulder blades

### If blockage not cleared

- Stand behind person
- Make a fist with one hand and place just above belly button of person
- Grab hold of fist with other hand
- Pull upwards and inwards sharply up to 5 times
- If blockage is not clear repeat procedures (5 back blows then 5 abdominal thrusts)
- Should the casualty become unconscious through blockage start CPR
- Once blockage removed recommend they seek medical advice if abdominal thrusts have been done or has difficulty swallowing.
- As a bonus recommend you watch 'Mrs Doubtfire' to see process in action.

This brand new event will take place at Curve Wake Part, St Osyth on Saturday 14th September and swimmers can choose to swim either 1.5km or 3km in aid of their local hospice.

The 1.5km is ideal if you're used to swimming in the confines of your local pool, or have yet to face longer distances, whilst the 3km route will push those looking for a longer challenge and is perfect for people training towards longer distance triathlons.

Lisa, St Helena's Events and Challenges Fundraiser, said: "We're really excited to launch this new event that will hopefully appeal to regular swimmers as well as those looking for a new or different challenge.

"This is the longest distance open water swimming event in north Essex and taking part is a great chance for people to experience the buzz of being part of a fantastic sporting event.

"All the money raised through people taking part in this sponsored swim will go towards helping local people face incurable illness and bereavement, supporting them, their families and carers."

## NORTH ESSEX GARDEN COMMUNITIES Stand by to respond to garden communities consultation this summer?

This summer is expected to see a new version of council plans for the three new towns in north Essex as they try to recover from a damning inspectors report.'

The original three proposals (24,000-home West Tey; 9,000-home East Colchester and 10-13,000 West of Braintree) were found unsound by a planning inspector last year. Since then, the lack of Plan in Braintree (Colchester is still operating under an old Plan) has allowed developers to make hay with speculative applications.

The authorities have been looking at around twenty-four 'garden community' alternatives, of which some are new, and never consulted on. One of these, for example, is the 5,000-home proposal at Kelvedon, known as Kings Dene.

Looking into the CAUSE crystal ball, we predict three things:

#### 1. Same Old.

It is very likely that the authorities will try to find new ways to justify their previous decision to build the same three new towns at their preferred sites.

#### 2. Infrastructure-Lite.

The authorities are likely to have to take an 'infrastructure-lite', 'infrastructure-later' or even, in some instances, 'infrastructure-never' approach.

We are basing this view on CAUSE's analysis of large developments currently under way elsewhere in England (although significantly smaller than proposed in north Essex). Those we have analysed do not offer the level of 'garden city' infrastructure or affordable housing we have been promised here.

And, remember big does not bring infrastructure In fact, the bigger you build and longer it takes, the greater your infrastructure, land and interest costs.

#### 3. Soothing promises.

There will be talk of public-private partnerships and investment from government but, we predict, very little solid evidence to back up the promises of how things will be paid for.

#### What can you do?

Time will tell if we are right but, whatever happens, CAUSE will be keeping people informed about the consultation and how you can respond in August & September. We will do this via a leaflet drop; social media, letters to the paper and, we hope, a village meeting or two.
