Wickets were shared among Sam King, Richard Pugh, Henry Dow and others. The Players fielding was good resulting to 2 run outs. Gareth Pugh wicket keeping was very efficient. 105 was required to win and the score reached 101 for 7 with 1 over remaining. 101 for 7 became 101 for 9 with 4 runs required. The suspense was unbearable as the 3rd ball of the last over was bowled to Nick Ross who hit it for 4 and thus, winning the game for For The Gentlemen. A good close game enjoyed by spectators and players.

NO TO WEST TEY, MONKS WOOD, KINGS DENE...

By October, Cause volunteers will have delivered 25,000 leaflets around North Essex. A big thank you to all the people involved in this exercise.

The leaflet outlined the effect that these developments would have on you and your communities if they succeed. There is a consultation taking place prior to the Inspector's second review taking place early in 2020.

Or send an email stating your name, address and a Statement of Concern: "I believe the garden community proposals are the wrong future for north Essex because....." to, cause@cause4livingessex.com.

In a nutshell here are some of the the arguments:-

Major problems with North Essex Garden Community proposals:

- Not needed and not the only way of doing things
- Not Popular and Not Affordable
- Too costly to the tax-payer, too risky & not financially viable. Promises that canot be paid for.
- Not enough jobs, extra 99,000 people: no new hospital
- No improvements to train services, but over 7.5k commuters and no new station.
- No proven routes for the too much countryside and farmland lost. Low density sprawl eats up 5,631 acres

Finally, beware the planned engagement programme by NEGC Ltd later this year. This tax-payer funded organisation has only one remit: to deliver the three new towns.
