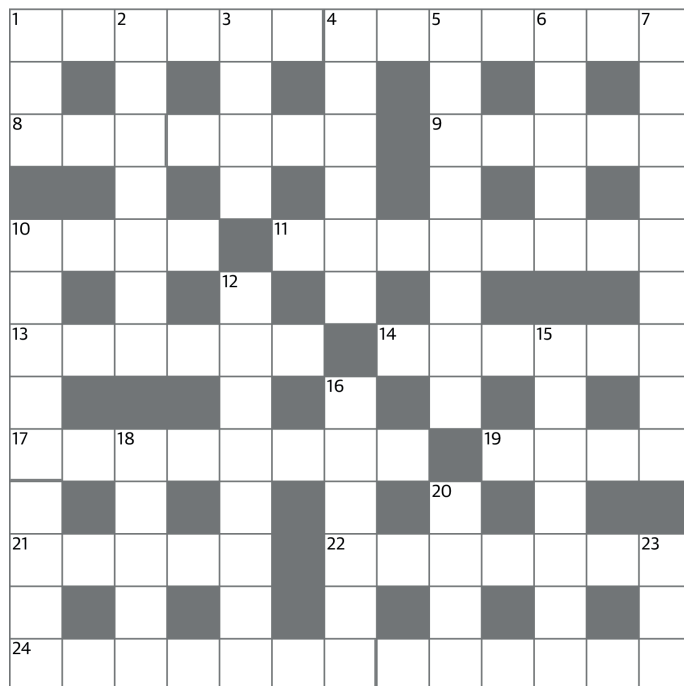

CALL FOR SITES

Circulation Problems

Angina

This is a condition usually caused by a build-up of a 'cholesterol Plaque' on the inner lining of a coronary artery.

Cholesterol is a fatty chemical, which is a part of the outer lining of cells in the body.

A cholesterol plaque is a hard thick substance caused by deposits of cholesterol on the artery wall.

Over a period of time this causes narrowing and hardening of the artery.

During exercise or excitement the heart needs more oxygen, but the narrowed coronary artery cannot increase the blood supply to meet its demand.

As a result an area of the heart will suffer a lack of oxygen.

This normally gives the casualty a pain in the chest as a result.

Typically an angina attack comes with exertion and goes with rest.

Heart Attack

This is often caused when the surface of a cholesterol plaque in the coronary artery ruptures and the contents leak out.

This leads to the formation of a blood clot, which can completely block the artery resulting in the death of an area of the heart muscle.

Unlike angina the death of the muscle from a heart attack is permanent and will not be relieved by rest alone.

Recognition

Angina

Chest pain following exertion or stress

Central chest pain can radiate through neck, jaw, arms

Can be mistaken for indigestion

Usually lasts 3 – 10 mins

Skin may look pale

Heart Attack

Onset is sudden, can also occur at rest

Central chest pain can radiate through neck, jaw, arms

Usually lasts longer than 30 mins

Skin is pale, grey and they may sweat profusely

Shortness of breath, nausea, or vomiting

Treatment

Sit casualty down and make them comfortable

Allow them or assist them with prescribed medication (normally GTN)

Reassure them

Remove anything that is causing stress or anxiety

If you suspect it's a heart attack and the casualty is not allergic to aspirin and older than 16,

Allow them to chew an aspirin slowly (150 -300mg)

Monitor their breathing
