## GREAT & LITTLE TEY COMMUNITY OUTREACH

A number of years ago Neighbourhood Outreach was formed by a group of like-minded volunteers to assist those in and around Great and Little Tey who needed a helping hand. Over the years the group have helped many in the village, but some of the original volunteers have moved on, new people have joined and the feeling is that perhaps not all who could benefit from a little help, are fully aware of the service and it is time for a re-launch.

In light of the Village's social theme the group is now re-named Community Outreach and the aim is still to offer help and advice to anyone in need. It may be that you are unable to drive for some reason and need to get to an appointment at a doctor's, dentist's, optician's or a hospital with no friend or relative able to take you – just telephone one of the volunteers.

You may need to pick up a prescription from the surgery or get in some shopping, you may want a lift to Church or simply visit a local friend or relative that, like you, cannot get out – Community Outreach can help.

Then there are the problems of official forms to fill in that sometimes need a bit of experience to fully comprehend or simple computer problems that require a bit of guidance to overcome – again just call Community Outreach.

Although originally formed to help the more elderly members of our village, younger people who are indisposed through injury or illness and with no relative or friend to take them to an appointment can also use the services of the group.

In this newspaper there is a card for you to keep, with details of Community Outreach and all the names and telephone numbers of the volunteers waiting to help. Pin it on your notice board or tuck it in your address book – Community Outreach is there for you if you need a helping hand, so give them a call.

### NO to North Essex Garden Comunities

Over the summer we distributed nearly 25,000 leaflets asking local residents to respond to the Local Plan consultation. We achieved twice the average direct mail response with 1800 people replying by postcard or email. Responses were collated and presented to the leader of Colchester Borough Council on the steps of the Town Hall, and all feedback was included in the CAUSE submission to the Planning Inspector.

The Examination in Public of the Local Plan began on 14th January at Colchester Community Stadium (CO4 5UP). CAUSE committee members and/or consultants were at the table for all sessions.

Members of the public were welcome to attend to watch proceedings (but not to contribute) and the timetable for the sessions that took place can be found here: https://www.braintree.gov.uk/info/200643/section\_1/1065/section\_1\_examination\_publication\_local\_plan/3

We are hugely encouraged that Colchester Borough Council voted last month not to make the next payment of £350,000 to North Essex Garden Communities before the outcome of the Examination is known.

We will update you on the outcome of the Examination in the next newsletter.
