GREAT TEY CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL MEMORIES

It is interesting to record school histories and appreciate what can be achieved by pupils who attend small Primary Schools. This is some of our recollections and memories.

The Brewer family moved to Great Tey in December 1976 from Sutton Coldfield. Jon and Nic initially attended the 'old' school at the junction of Chappel Road and Moor Road. They were 6 and 8 years old. The new school opened in 1977. There were three classes which operated on a 2 year tier system. The numbers gradually increased as more new houses and bungalows were sold and became occupied.

Mr K. Thacker, the Headmaster, took the seniors, Mrs Locke the juniors and Mrs S Scott the infants. The Secretary was Mrs Wall, who lived in the Village, and was also a swimming instructor and taught many of the children to swim. When she moved to Chappel she would catch the early morning bus down to the Village and a school bus home.

Mrs Coffin was the supply teacher and she started a 'bird club' after school. Mrs Albarn of Aldham attended the school occasionally and undertook art work projects (her son, Damon, became the front singer for the famous group Blur).

Mothers helped on a regular basis with reading and needlework. Fathers gave up their time at weekends to dig out the footings for a school swimming pool. When the pool was finished a summer fete was held to celebrate .The pool was available during the summer holidays staffed by volunteer mothers on a rota basis.

The dinner ladies were Mrs Cherry and Mrs Peterson who both had children at the school. I believe Mrs King was the cook. The cleaner was Mrs Eady. The Estate was still being built when the School first opened and the boys had to wear wellies to school and change at the gates – woe betide anybody trailing mud into Mrs Eady's newly cleaned floors!

Nic attended Honywood School and when he left was accepted onto a Police Vocational Course at Chelmsford College, becoming a Police Cadet and voted 'Cadet of the Year'. When he passed out at Ashford Police Training College he was appointed the youngest Police Constable in Essex and was assigned to Harlow Police – during his Police career he was awarded a 'Bravery' commendation.

When Jon attended Great Tey School the PTA bought some P.E. mats and engaged a coach to form a school Gym Club. The coach believed Jon showed promise, but there was no boys club at that time in Colchester so he joined a girls club, subsequently joining a new boy's club that was formed at Stanway School.

Jon also attended Honywood School and continued his gymnastics. He was asked to join the Harlow Gym Club which at that time was the leading club in the country. He was coached by Mitch Fenner (who became a B.B.C. gymnastic commenter and who sadly passed away in 2016). No funding in those days and Mum became a Taxi driver 5 days a week to take Jon training at Harlow. Dad did Saturdays. Despite sustaining a broken arm in training, which had to be plated, Jon became the Junior British Rings Champion.
