



What are the 'Collects'?

Whether you are a regular church goer or just attend services occasionally, you may have noticed that there always seems to be a prayer headed 'the collect'. Perhaps you have asked yourself why on earth is a prayer called a 'collect'.

The answer is that it is a hangover from pre-Reformation times when services were in Latin. The name 'collect' comes from the Latin 'to gather'. Probably it was a prayer said at the beginning of a service, when people had 'gathered together' and was intended to remind the congregation of everything that would follow. It has 4 parts to it. Firstly, there is a description of God, secondly a petition, ie asking God for something. This is followed by the reason for asking and finally an acknowledgement that we dare to ask because of the promises made by Jesus Christ while He was on earth.

The Collects as we have them now, were written by Thomas Cranmer in 1556 as part of his new prayer book following the Reformation. He clearly thought 'Collect' was a useful catch all name for a different prayer for every Sunday, but one that would be said throughout the land.


SALVIAS

It is a good time of year to take a critical look at the garden and see if you have anything flowering at the moment or indeed about to flower. Dahlias should be going strong, but after a hot month (not this year!) the garden can look a bit short on flowers and a bit bedraggled. Salvias can come to your rescue.

Salvias are great at the end of summer. There are lots of varieties. Some are annual and can be found in garden centres this late in the season and can be popped into any gaps in the garden. I have guite a few small shrubby varieties in shades of pink, blue and purple. They are not entirely hardy if we have a very cold patch of weather. However, they are very easy to take cuttings from. Cut a non flowering branch just below a joint, about 6 inches long, take most of the leaves off and put it in a pot, around the edge, in any compost with about one third grit added. Put a plastic bag over the pot and place in a shady spot in the garden. Take it in when the weather gets colder and put it somewhere sheltered, in a conservatory or greenhouse if you have one and by next spring you should have plants to put in the garden.

If you have a border against a wall try Salvia Amistad. Mine is flowering its head off. Its flowers are dark purple and about 8 feet tall. It isn't absolutely hardy, but against a wall or fence it should be fine. Mine has survived for about 4 years, but I do take cuttings just in case. I wouldn't be without it. I prefer it to all those yellow and orange daisies that are about just now.
