

### **FALSE HELLEBORINE**

You may not have heard of this plant or perhaps you know it by its Latin name – Veratrum. I have been growing it in my garden for years. It comes in two colour ways, white or black. It grows wild in France and elsewhere in Europe, but not in the UK. It is hard

to describe as it is very much a one off. It has very attractive bright green leaves, a bit like a hosta's but 'pleated'. These grow in a clump out of which shoots a tall stem with tiny greeny white flowers or black ones, at the top. I have to say it is slow to establish, but worth the wait. By the way it is not a helleborine at all. White helleborine is in fact a variety of orchid which does grow wild in the UK.

Back to Veratrum – I also grow an American relative – Veratrum Californicum. Sometimes called the Californian false helleborine or corn lily. This is a giant! Its flowering stems are about 2 metres high and it can form

very large clumps, but it certainly impresses visitors to your garden.

You may wonder what made me think of mentioning these rather obscure plants. Well, I think they deserve to be better known. They are easy to grow, will tolerate some shade and some waterlogging and they look spectacular. The other reason I thought of them is that my American clump has got way too big. I need to split it up. I have never done this before and I have a feeling that it will be a bit challenging. I did not know whether I should divide it up now, in the autumn, or

wait until spring. In the event those that know, seem to suggest that either will do.

However it leads me to the general point that it is always worth thinking a little before you wade into the border to move plants. If there is any thought that

> a plant is a little bit tender such as the salvias we talked about a few weeks ago, it is better to move them in the spring if you can.

> Of course there are no hard and fast rules and sometimes we just have to take a risk. I am about to create a new iris bed – the large bearded irises – I should have done that in August, always the recommended time to move or split the rhizomes, but somehow it didn't get done. I shall go ahead, nevertheless, and keep my fingers tightly crossed!

PS: If you do think of growing Veratrum (available from Beth Chatto), I

discovered the other day that it is very poisonous, so take care when handling. However the Bartleet family (and dogs) have survived for many years alongside this plant!

PPS: I mentioned last month the problem of tulips and squirrels. Yes they do dig up mine, but the text went on to read as if they buried them again – would that they did! It's walnuts that they bury instead and they are a real nuisance in the borders!
