COUNCIL NEWS

THE GRASS BANK IN THE STREET

The parish council have asked that the grass bank is not mowed until the end of May to promote wildflowers and wildlife in that area.

PRESCRIPTION DELIVERY SERVICE AT THE VILLAGE HALL

The parish council wrote to the doctors' surgery regarding the decision to stop taking requests for medications over the telephone, as concern had been expressed by some parishioners. We were advised that there are a few different ways of ordering which were explained on a leaflet that was distributed to patients. Currently these are:

Online – register for online services via their website. There is no need for patients to travel to the surgery for this. They will simply be asked a few security questions over the phone to be given a username and password.

Via the NHS App on a smart phone.

By giving the repeat slips back to the driver when patients collect their medications from the village hall.

By sending a request through the post.

By asking friends or family to order for them.

PYLONS - HAVE YOUR SAY

National Grid is consulting on proposals to reinforce the high-voltage electricity transmission network from Norwich Main substation in Norfolk, to Bramford substation in Suffolk and on to Tilbury substation in Essex, as well as a proposed connection substation to connect new offshore wind generation.



include Proposals building а new 400,000 volt (400kV) electricity transmission line over adistance of 180km and a new 400kV connection substation in the Tendring District. The reiforcement will comprise mainly overhead lines, including pylons measuring up to 50m in height, with underground cabling through the Dedham Vale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The 'preferred corridor' for the electricity transmission line runs south-west from Ipswich to the proposed connection substation near Ardleigh, then across the north of Colchester, before heading southwest past Eight Ash Green, West Bergholt, through Aldham, past Great Tey and on towards Coggeshall.

The initial public consultation runs until 16 June 2022. 
OPEN GARDEN June 2022



Gardening Notes June 2022 ROSEMARY

I am very fond of rosemary and wouldn't be without it in the garden. It smells good, it flowers early, it is evergreen and I like to use it in cooking – what's not to like!

As I sit at my computer, I can see the top of my oldest Rosemary bush. It is flowering its head off, thick with new shoots and looking in the peak of health. What is so surprising about that you might ask. Well, the received lore about rosemary is that it is a bit like lavender. It should be fine for a year or two but after that it gets woody and old and then in a cold spell in winter it will die. This one has been in its current spot for at least 40 years. What has been the secret of success?

As usual it is a combination soil conditions, climate and variety. Normally rosemary, a plant of the Mediterranean, would hate my Essex clay that is cold and wet in the winter and ill drained at the best of times. However, this plant has layered itself into my gravel drive and it is sheltered from the worst of the cold by the house and in any case our winters aren't that cold these days. The variety is Miss Jessup's Upright, probably the hardiest and easiest to grow of them all. It needs very little looking after, just picking bits to put in a vase or under a lamb joint is enough to keep it in shape.

If you want to be a bit more adventurous there are some other very pretty varieties that are worth a try. You will have to be even more careful where you plant them as they are a bit less hardy and will need well drained soil and a sheltered spot if they are going to succeed. Tuscan Blue has much deeper blue flowers and a slightly prostrate habit. I grow it hanging over a low wall with shelter and good drainage. I am excited about a new variety I have recently acquired called Foxtail. It too is prostrate and has pretty, silvery leaves and bushy stems – a bit like a foxtail. We shall see if it is going to thrive or even survive, that's the exciting thing about gardening – you never know until you try!
