YOUR LOCAL LIBRARY

Is your child starting primary school?

Starting primary school can be scary for children and their families. You can take the scare factor out by coming to one of our Big School Meet Ups before the big day in September. You can get the chance to meet other children and their families who will be starting at your own child's school.

There have been several of these events already, but they'll be continuing until the end of August. See what's happening at your local library for details. And if you've missed the event for your own local school, don't worry – you can still come along to one of the others, chat, listen to a storytime and get some tips and tricks.

Recycling at your local library

Here's a tip about disposing of your empty ink cartridges in an eco-friendly way. Take them to your local library.

Every library has a new Ink Bin recycling box to put your empty home-use ink cartridges in. Once they're collected, they'll be sorted, refilled and put back on the market as remanufactured ink cartridges. This will stop them ending up in landfill.

What else does your local library recycle? Most will take old batteries; some take small electrical items too. Save yourself a trip to the recycling centre!

If you're running short of recycling sacks or caddies for roadside collections, your local library may be the place to help. Food sacks, garden sacks and recycling boxes can all be found at some of our libraries.

Coverage does vary, so check out the recycling facilities available at your local library.

Book groups and Essex Library Service

Are you keen to share your thoughts about a book you've read? Can't wait to find out what others thought of it, too? Starting a book group is a great way to stay in touch regularly with book lovers and to make new friends.

Essex Library Service helps book groups in many ways. By registering your group with us you can reserve multiple copies of your chosen book which can be borrowed for up to three months, and you chose to be added to the list of book groups which can be shared with other interested readers. Our website can give your group ideas for what to read.

Summer Reading Challenge

A reminder that the Summer Reading Challenge – Gadgeteers – is running until Saturday 3 September in all Essex libraries and mobile libraries.

To take part, children will need their own library card, so if anyone in your family is not a library member pop down to your local library to join or join online now.

We are in Great Tey at some point daily from Tuesday to Friday and the van can be tracked via our website www.barronfarms.co.uk or Facebook Page.

Charlie has been running the shop since I left to have a baby. He has done a great job and without his enthusiasm and commitment, the shop would have shut a year ago. We have also had Kelly on board for a few months alternating weeks with Charlie. Unfortunately, Kelly is soon to be finishing with us so if anyone would like to do a 4 day week job every other week then please get in touch. Firstly, an old adage 'location, Location, Location'. We live in a sought-after Essex village with a great community atmosphere, history and amenities, fantastic Church & working bells, great Pub, School & open spaces yet still close enough to some major towns, cities and transport links. Gardening Notes August 2022 THE WINNERS AND LOSERS!



No one could say it has been an easy summer for gardening!

As we all know the challenge has been rain, or rather lack of it. WE seem to have only had a couple of decent downpours, lasting over several days, since the beginning of March. I have been watering the garden, on and off, for the last 5 months.

So I thought I would take you on a virtual tour to see what might have survived without so much attention and also take a long hard look at those plants which I really shouldn't try to grow in these desert conditions.

The stars of the show have been the salvias. There have been lots and lots of new varieties that have been developed in recent years. All of them will stand dry hot conditions better than most plants. I have some favourites. One of the best for the taller varieties is *salvia scalarea turkestanica* – a bit of a mouthful, but a very pretty biennial. It has pale mauve and pink bracts and furry grey leaves. It seeds itself gently around and I wouldn't be without it.

Salvia nemorosa is a very useful group of plants. About 18" tall, it comes in all sorts of cultivars. One that I like a lot is called 'caradonna'. It has spikes of dark blue flowers and I have it planted at intervals down my herbaceous border.

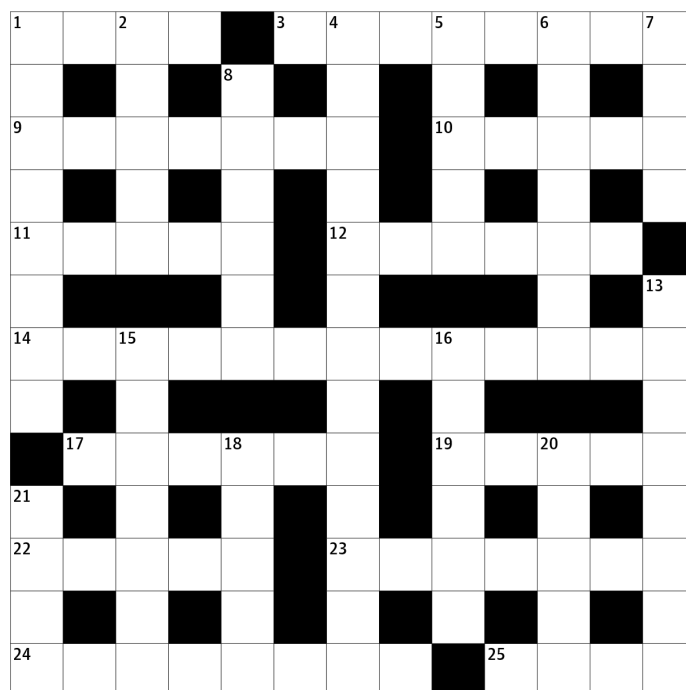
Sedums are another group of plants which have shown no signs of struggling with the heat. There is a particular group of them called 'sunsparkler'. They are compact and come in a variety of shades, ideal for the front of the border.

Another front of border plant that is looking very perky regardless of whether I water it or not is **euphorbia myrsinites**. A ground hugging grey glaucous leaved plant, it looks good all through the summer.

So what about the things we shouldn't be planting? Well, they are legion! Unless one is prepared to water all summer, a traditional herbaceous border may well be doomed to failure. I love phlox, stalwarts of the August border, but they hate the heat, need lots of water and a rich well drained soil with lots of organic matter in it and this is only the start of a long list including many bedding out annuals, that don't like what has been happening to the garden in recent weeks. More planning needed, without a doubt!
