



BOTTLE STALL FOR CHURCH FETE



You may remember that earlier in the year we circulated new guidelines for everyone who currently has relatives or friends buried in the churchyard or who might wish to be buried there in the future.

To all those who have taken note of those changes and put them into practise – thank you.

You may also remember that we said that from time to time we would tidy up the churchyard and remove any inappropriate items. Those items to be put in the church porch for the owners to collect.

To avoid a build up of unclaimed items, we will remove those items from the porch at the following times of year;

at the end of January

just before Easter


at the end of June

at the end of September

Please help us by remembering that our preference and the Diocesan rules insist on, fresh flowers only on graves and, generally, only one bunch at a time. These need to be removed when dead. If pot plants have crept in, please remove empty ones and ones with dead plants.

GARDENING NOTES June 2023

Biennials

If you watched Monty Don the other day, you will have heard him talk about sowing biennials to flower next year. It is a great idea! I don't know whether you have noticed but plants in garden centres have gone up a lot in price. I know, too that lots of people have still got gaps to fill after last winter.

Now is the time to sow biennials. I am suggesting a few which are very easy to grow. If you sow them now they will be ready to plant out where you want them in September/October. They will flower merrily next spring/summer.

If you need something tall for the back of your borders, foxgloves are a great bet. They are often mentioned in gardening books as woodlanders. It is quite true that they grow really well in shady spots. I find that they seed themselves into south facing flowerbeds just as well. There are lots of varieties to choose from. I am particularly fond of the straight forward 'alba' – a white variety of the wild foxglove. There is a pretty apricot version called 'Suttons' Apricot'. From one packet of seed you will get lots of very hardy seedlings. Another unfussy back of the border plant is 'Hesperis' or Sweet Rocket. It has lots of white or mauve flowers and once you have it in the garden you have it for life!

There are lots more you can try – wall flowers, sweet William, hollyhocks, to name but a few.

Here are a few 'specials' which are worth trying. They are no more difficult to grow but you may need to look on the internet to find a supplier of the seed. I like Honesty and I have lots of it in the garden in white and purple. But the one I really prize is varigated white flowered honesty. I am not always a big fan of variegated plants, but this one just sings out in early spring when we all need cheering up. It self sows too.

Erodium pelargoniflorum – now sometimes called erodium trifolium, is another one I wouldn't be without. It has white and maroon flowers and greyish leaves and flowers its head off! It self seeds too. You can sow seed any time but keep this somewhere not too hot while germinating and starting to grow.

Finally the best yet! Eryngium giganteum Miss Willmot's ghost. This is a wonderful sea holly. It grows to about 60 cms. Its blooms are white and make super Christmas decorations if dried. I have had it in the garden for 50 years where it gently self sows. It may take a bit longer to



flower, but worth the wait. It is easy to grow – just sprinkle over a seed tray in the autumn. Leave it outside all winter and low and behold seedlings next spring. If you want some seed just apply to me!

Finally, a word of warning – the very high temperatures that we are having can make caring for small seedlings tricky. Try growing on a bright but shady windowsill or sow straight into the ground somewhere that avoids afternoon sun not into a hot greenhouse or conservatory.


Unfortunately there will be not be a meeting this month.
