Tell your friends it's a great afternoon. Bingo is held on the 2nd Thursday of the month.



A120 ROADWORKS

National Highways are planning to carry out maintenance and improvement work on the A120 between Marks Farm and Marks Tey. The work will include improving the road surface and road markings. Once complete drivers will benefit from safer, smoother and a better defined road.

The work is scheduled from early October to January 2024 and will be weeknights only weather conditions permitting. Work will not be completed during the Christmas period from 19th December to 2nd January.

To carry out the work safely it is necessary to close both eastbound and westbound of the A120. Traffic will be diverted as detailed in the map of the diversion below along which also includes a link to more detailed information.

It is called "Tell us and Track it" and can be found at Tell us - Essex County Council (essexhighways. org). There is also an interactive map which will enable you to see the defects reported in the local area and their current status

GARDENING NOTES October 2023

I have been puzzling over a new sort of challenge in recent weeks. That is not to say that there isn't lots to do in my own garden. After all the funny weather we have had, some things are looking stressed from too much water and some from not enough and the whole garden looks a bit tatty! If yours does too, don't despair, you are not alone!

No, this is a different problem. One of my sons has just acquired a house with a minute 'garden' well actually an open space about 4metres x 4 metres. It is paved and surrounded by quite high walls and his family has ambitions to turn it into a green, lovely, space.

On top of everything else, apart from one small corner, it gets almost no sun. The family aren't there all the time nor are they passionate gardeners. What to goodness is the answer?

Artificial grass and plastic green plants? I hope we can do better than that.

The first thing to do is to invest in a simple watering system, otherwise everything will die! The next thing is think about pots. It is always better, in these circumstances to go for a small number of large pots rather than lots of small ones - more impact, easier to keep watered. Find pots you like in a range of large sizes, but don't buy them until you have bought your plants. Then you can have the right size for the plants you have bought.

Then the fun starts! There is one sunny spot, so what about Trachelospermum? It's a climber, it's tough and it's scented, it's evergreen, what's not to like? If the walls are painted, better to grow on a bit of trellis. After that look up shrubs that are tough and don't mind shade and I would suggest, most should be evergreen. Bare branches are a bit dreary in winter. It is a good idea to have one small tree/large bush. My son is keen to have a Japanese maple, not evergreen but pretty all the rest of the year. A camellia is a good choice, it likes pot life, and you can give it the soil it likes. Go for the variety sasanqua as the flowers drop rather than go brown. If there is shady spot and you water them enough, the large flowered hydrangeas are great. there is a pretty one called Limelight and another Vanilla Fraise. Bay trees are very unfussy you can trim them or leave them as natural bush. What about bamboo? They are airy, rustle in the wind and can't spread if in a pot.

These are just a few ideas to be going on with. You may not have the extreme conditions my son has, but all the above could apply to a small north facing terrace, owned by someone who wants green impact without too much maintenance!
