Don't forget there will not be another paper until the February edition so please send in all your articles for publication by the copy deadline on the back page.


Thanks to everyone who has supported this paper throughout the year and I hope you and all our readers have a good Christmas and may 2024 be good for you. *Ed.*


Any ladies interested in joining us will be very welcome, we meet on the first Tuesday of the month in the Village Hall for. 7.30pm start. Look forward to seeing you.

A quarter peal takes a considerable amount of physical coordination, stamina and mental concentration. Each bell rings 1260 changes, taking approximately 45 minutes, of a mathematical method in this case called Plain Bob Doubles. Both Rose (on 24.10.23) and Matthew (on 27.10.23) completed this without a single mistake, which is an amazing achievement. Rose and Matthew joined Great Tey bell ringers in August 2022 as they wanted to learn to ring for the skills part of the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme.

We are very proud of all our ringers at Great Tey, especially those who have learned this ancient art of change ringing since Covid. There have been many achievements such as; first quarter peals for Mick Stone and Bruce Knights, ringing for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's funeral on half muffled bells, His Majesty King Charles III's Coronation, weddings and Sunday Services.

GARDENING NOTES 2023/January 2024

The Holly and the Ivy


I love decorating the house for Christmas and this is the time of year when we all need to pick the holly that has berries, ready to bring into the house and put on the Christmas pudding. We will have to get on with it as I have seen and heard flocks of fieldfares in the hedges and they, along with redwings and blackbirds will make short work of those berries.

Bringing evergreens into the house at this time of year goes back to pre-Christian times when it was done to encourage the gods to remember the need sponsor the rebirth of all the otherwise 'dead' plants that were so important for survival. The early church didn't want to spoil the fun associated with the winter solstice, so why not graft it on to the celebration of Christ's birth?

I grow quite a few varieties of holly in the garden as well as some different ivies, so here a few thoughts on what you might like to grow. The first thing to say about holly, is that although it is not the most rapid of shrubs to grow, once established, it will grow about a foot a year. Holly is unfussy. It will grow in shade but will do better in semi shade or sunshine. It will stand any amount of pruning and you can, of course, use it like yew or box, to cut into shapes. In my time I have made 9 lollypops from hollies! I have started with 18 inch single stems and within a few years have achieved fine bobbles on top of 4 foot stems.

What about varieties? It is worth remembering that by and large it is female varieties that produce the berries and they will need a male for pollination. However there is one variety, J. van Tol which is female and self pollinating. However, it has very few spines on the leaves which doesn't seem quite right to me! I mustn't get caried away because I am very fond of holly and have quite a few in the garden. Do have a look on line for yourselves and remember that even if they don't have berries, the variegated varieties light up a dark corner.

Of the silver edged varieties, I would choose Handsworth New Silver – I have some excellent clipped specimens, or Argentea Marginata – a good all round



doer. Of the golden variegated ones, Golden Milkboy is one of my favourites. In checking out these varieties on line, I spotted Ilex Ingrammii, which has pinkish new growth – I think I will have to try it!

WARNING! Don't be tempted to grow *Ilex Crenata – Japanese Holly*, if you garden on heavy Essex clay. It doesn't like it! Often sold now as a substitute for box, it likes acid soil. Fine in a pot but not in the soil. A few years ago, I had to pull up 300 small plants that had failed. An expensive mistake!

I have run out of space to talk about Ivy! Another time?

Although the nature of farming has changed over the centuries, Plough Sunday is seen as a way of generally celebrating farming and the work of farmers.
